## About Import and Export license (I/E license) under Fisheries and Wildlife Department

Every person is required to obtain I/E License prior to commercially import or export from the United States shipments containing wildlife, their parts or products. I/E Licenses are issued only by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) Office of Law Enforcement (OLE) and are issued to entities (companies or individuals) before they commercially import into or export from the United States shipments containing wildlife (including their parts and products).

I/E Licenses are separate from any other permit that is issued by FWS (like CITES). Other permits do not replace the necessity for an I/E License if wildlife shipments are being imported for commercial purposes.

### Procedure to obtain I/E License

- Submission of online application to US Fish and Wildlife Service Department
- Review of application by the department
- Grant of permit

It may take up to **60 working days** to obtain the license

### Validity & Fee structure

I/E license is valid for a period of one year. The license can be further renewed for a period of one year.




